Core Values

Doctrinal Statement: *“Jesus answered them, and said, My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me. If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.”* John 7:16-17 KJV

The Bible: We believe that the Holy Bible is the written Word of the Living God. We believe it was inspired by the Holy Spirit and recorded by holy men of old. It is infallible in content and a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction, which is truth without any mixture of errors. When we speak of the divine nature of the Bible, it applies strictly speaking to the original writings (the Autographs) and not to the translations; however, we believe mankind has received the actual Word of God in His divine plan, as the Bible has withstood all attempts at its extinction down through the ages. The Bible reveals the principles by which God will judge us and reveals His great plan of salvation. It will remain eternally. We believe the Bible is the true center of Christian union and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions should be tried. Therefore, we believe this Word should go into all the world and should be given first place in every believer's life (2 Timothy 3:16; Hebrews 4:12; 1 Peter 1:23-25; and 2 Peter 1:19-21).

The Godhead: We believe in one God revealed in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit...making up the blessed Trinity. The Scriptures clearly teach that there is one God who is an infinite being and who exists in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Each person is wholly God, equal in power and glory, and possesses precisely the same attributes and perfection. Though undivided in nature and being, they each have different roles, eternally functioning with perfect harmony. (Deuteronomy 6:4, Matthew 28:18-20, John 1:1-14, John 14:514, Matthew 3:16,17; 1 John 5:6,7).

Salvation: We believe the terms of salvation are repentance toward God for sin and a personal, heartfelt faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. This is how the new birth occurs, which we call being “born again.” Salvation is possible only through God’s grace by faith, not by our works. When one believes and accepts Christ, he is then justified by the saving work of the Cross. Good works are simply the fruit or proof of salvation (Acts 3:19,20; Romans 4:1-5, 5:1; Ephesians 2:8-10). Water Baptism should immediately follow the experience of the new birth as a public witness to one’s faith (Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38).

Body of Christ: We believe the Body of Christ is made up of all who have been “born again” regardless of denominational differences. We believe in the spirit of unity, while allowing for variety in individual ministries as to their work, calling, and location as directed by the Holy Spirit (Acts 10:34,35; 1 Corinthians 12:1231).

Blood Atonement: We believe in the saving power of the blood of Jesus and His imputed righteousness (Acts 4:12; Romans 4:1-9, 5:1-11; Ephesians 1:3-14).

Bodily Resurrection: We believe in the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ (Luke 24:39-43; John 20:24-29).

Ascension: We believe that Christ Jesus ascended to the Father and is presently engaged in building a place for us in His Kingdom and interceding for the saints (John 14:2,3; Romans 8:34).

Second Coming: We believe in the visible, bodily return of Christ Jesus to this earth, to meet His Church (Bride) and to judge the world (Acts 1:10,11; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-10; James 5:8; Revelation 1:7).

Judgment: God has appointed a day when he will judge the world with perfect justice through Jesus Christ, to whom he has given all power and authority. On that day, the fallen angels will be judged, as well as everyone who has ever lived on the earth. All must appear before the judgment seat of Christ to give an account for everything they have done (their thoughts, words, and actions) while they lived on the earth. The Lord Jesus will give his unchangeable verdict on that day, forever sealing the destinies of everyone. The wicked will be sent into the Lake of Fire to experience eternal torment, while the righteous, those whom Jesus purchased on the cross, will be rewarded and will enter into eternal life (John 5:24-30, Jude 5-7, 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, 1 Corinthians 4:1-5, Matthew 25:31-46, Revelation 20:11-15).

Holy Spirit: We believe the Holy Spirit to be the third person of the S.A.V.E.D. Global, whose purpose in the redemption of man is to convict of sin, regenerate the repentant believer, guide the believer into all truth, indwell all believers, and give gifts to those He wills that they may minister as Christ would to men. We believe that the manifestations of the Holy Spirit recorded in 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 will operate through present-day Christians who yield to Jesus (Luke 11:13; John 7:37-39, 14:16, 17, 16:7-14; Acts 2:1-18).

Baptism in the Holy Spirit: We believe the baptism in the Holy Spirit, with the evidence of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance (1 Corinthians 14), is for all believers as promised by John the Baptist (Matthew 3:11), Jesus (Acts 1:4-8), and Peter (Acts 2:38-41). The fulfillment of this promise was witnessed by early disciples of Christ (Acts 2:4, 10:44-47, 19:1-6) and operates in many present-day disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Divine Healing: We believe God has used doctors, medicines, and other natural means as channels of healing; however, we believe divine healing is provided for believers in the atonement made by Jesus' blood shed on the cross (Isaiah 53:5; 1 Peter 2:24). We believe divine healing may be received by the laying on of hands by the elders (James 5:14-16), by the prayer of an anointed person gifted by the Holy Spirit for healing the sick (1 Corinthians 12:9), or by a direct act of receiving this provision by faith (Mark 11:23, 24).

Marriage: Marriage was originally established by God to join a man and a woman together for life. Believers are instructed to only marry another believer. Marriage serves a variety of God-ordained purposes. Its primary purpose is to provide companionship. A secondary purpose is procreation. Another reason for marriage is to provide a legitimate outlet for our sexual drive. Marriage also functions as a

picture of the relationship between Jesus Christ and the church. (Genesis 2:18-25, Ephesians 5:22-33, 1 Corinthians 7:39-40, Romans 7:1-3, Genesis 1:26-31, 1 Corinthians 7:1-7).

Global is a non-governmental accreditation agency that extends accreditation exclusively to private Christian institutions upon inspection and approval of their programs, operations, and integrity. Every student who is mentored at various institutions worldwide is registered as an online student at our USA campus, and we merely supply books in various countries through legitimate book suppliers.

Homosexuality and Transgenderism

S.A.V.E.D. Global's foundation for understanding these issues is rooted in our commitment to the Bible as the only authoritative guide for faith and practice. The first two chapters of Genesis constitute the standard paradigm of God's creative intent for human personhood, gender, gender identity, and sexual intimacy in marriage.

God created humanity with two distinct sexual characteristics: male and female. God's divine standard and intent for marriage, as expressed in Genesis 2, is between one man and one woman. Within the context, sexual intimacy is a glorious blessing from God and a fundamental aspect of human experience. Based on creation theology, biblical theology, Leviticus 18, I Corinthians 5-6, and other passages, we must conclude that homosexual activities and same-sex romantic relationships are a tragic reflection of the brokenness of the human condition and thus a sinful deviation from God's standard, and wrong under any circumstance in God's eyes.

We do not single out homosexual activities and same-sex relationships but affirm sexual intimacy within the context of marriage between a man and a woman and reject all forms of sexual unholiness; first in our own lives, but also in the lives of others whom we have a responsibility and privilege to love.

We affirm God's love and concern for all of humanity, including those brothers and sisters who struggle with same-sex attractions, and those who experience discord between their biological sex and psychological gender. We regard sex at birth as the identification of the given biological sex of each member of our constituency, including employees and students. We will not accept as valid alterations of one's sex at birth based on experiential variation or medical intervention.

Admissions

Registration Period:

The regular registration period is approximately 6-8 weeks before the beginning of each semester, through the media available for students at S.A.V.E.D. Through publicized notices, orientation materials, and the handbook calendars provided by S.A.V.E.D Global University, students can access detailed information on registration periods.

Admission Policies: Applicants for admission to S.A.V.E.D Global University

S.A.V.E.D. Global University will be considered regardless of race, gender, handicap, or national or ethnic origin according to our Nondiscriminatory Policy. S.A.V. E. D Global University Admission Board assesses the prospective student.

S.A.V.E.D. Global University reserves the right to refuse admission to any prospective student. Admission decisions are based on an evaluation of all required materials. All candidates who wish to be considered must submit the required documentation by the appropriate application deadline.

All documentation and credentials submitted become the property of S.A.V.E.D. Global University and will not be returned to the applicant. Therefore, the applicants should make photocopies of the materials submitted for personal records and future use.

Admission Procedures:

S.A.V.E.D. Global uses a selective admissions process. Not all applicants will be accepted into the School of Ministry. The Admissions Department will make the final decision.

General Requirements for Admission:

Each applicant must be 18 years or older and submit the following forms to the Admissions office, accompanied by a **non-negotiable and non-refundable \$75.00** application fee. All forms must be received **no later than 30 days before** the beginning of the semester in which the student seeks enrollment:

All the required documentation and fees have been received; the Admissions. The department will notify the applicant of an approved student application to S.A.V.E.D. Global University is valid for six months from the date of original approval.

Orientation: S.A.V.E.D. Global University requires students to be present on the designated orientation day, with no exceptions. Orientation is a mandatory graduation requirement for all incoming students; any exception to attending the scheduled session must be approved by the Dean of Students at least one week before orientation.

Application Deadlines: Prospective students may apply as early as a year in advance of planned enrollment. For the fall semester, applications will be accepted from April 1 to May 30, and late registration will be available from June 1-30. For the spring semester, applications will be accepted from October 1 to November 15, and late registration will be available from November 16 to December 1. There is an additional non-refundable \$25.00 assessment fee for all late registrations.

Applications will be processed once all required documentation and fees have been submitted. An admission decision will be made two weeks before orientation.

Admission Acceptance:

Applications are only processed when all required documentation and fees have been submitted, and an admission decision will be mailed two weeks before orientation. All files must be completed before notification. If you receive an acceptance letter from S.A.V.E.D. Global, you must attend your scheduled orientation.

Waiting List: S.A.V.E.D. Global University can only accept a limited number of students each semester. If you are accepted and the institute has reached its maximum number of students for the semester, your name will be placed on a waiting list.

Academic Programs: Refund Policy

S.A.V.E.D. Global is committed to integrity, stewardship, and excellence in all financial and academic matters. Due to the nature of our training programs and the access provided to course materials, the following refund policy applies:

1. Application & Enrollment Fees

All application and enrollment fees are non-refundable. These fees cover administrative processing and student onboarding.

2. Tuition Payments

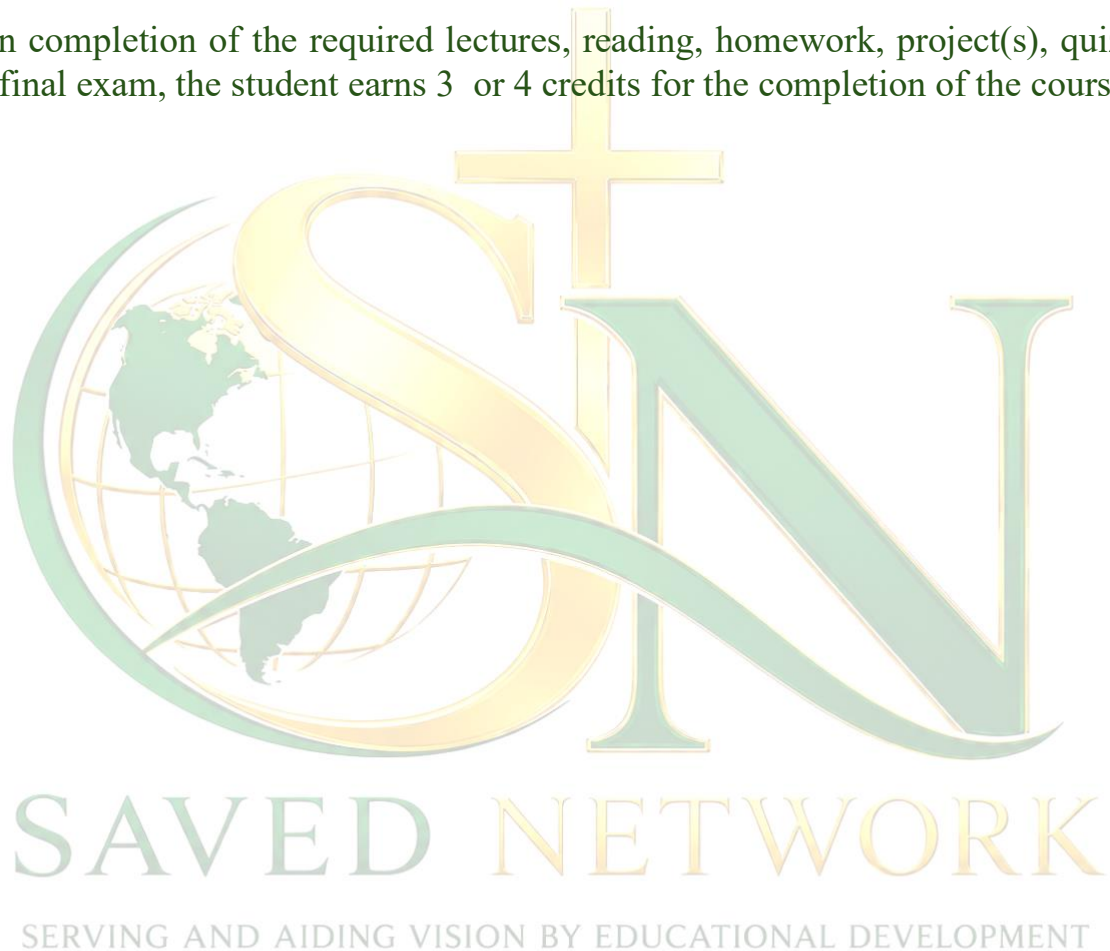
Credit System:

S.A.V.E.D. Global operates on a session system. The unit for counting credit is as follows: Each session consists of twelve (10- 12) classes within six weeks.

Students are responsible for attending lectures twice per week.

Each student is responsible for completing all homework, projects, and required reading assigned through the course syllabus and by the instructor.

Upon completion of the required lectures, reading, homework, project(s), quizzes, and final exam, the student earns 3 or 4 credits for the completion of the course.



Course Completion Date: Each student is required to complete the requirements for each course within the allotted time frame (Session). Failure to complete the requirements on time will result in an automatic reduction in grade by one grade. Students may be granted an extension of one to two weeks. However, the granting of an extension is at the discretion of the instructor.

Grade Appeal Process:

If a student believes there is an error on their grade report, they must begin the appeal process within 30 days of receiving it. After thirty days, the grade is considered final and is not subject to appeal by the student or any third party.

S.A.V.E.D. Global is not responsible for lost tests, projects, or other materials. Please be sure to make a copy of all material before submitting it to S.A.V.E.D. Global for grading or evaluation.

Dropping/Adding Courses:

If there is a specific problem with the course content, the Registrar's Office of S.A.V.E.D. Global should be notified immediately.

Course Repeating Policy:

Students desiring to repeat a course for the purpose of having the first grade removed from the cumulative grade point average must follow these procedures:

1. A course may be repeated once at no additional charge if the student receives a grade of less than "C".
2. A course may be repeated for an additional charge if the student receives a "C" or higher.
3. The second grade, in all circumstances, replaces the first grade for the purpose of calculating the cumulative grade point average.

Any student receiving an "F" or "I" must contact the Registrar's Office for further instructions. No student will be allowed to graduate with an "F" or "I" in a required course. Any undergraduate student receiving three "F's" will be placed on academic probation. Any graduate student receiving two "F's" will be placed on academic probation.

Course Selection:

If a student has completed a course that is required in his or her program of study, the student may request a change of course. The student must have received a

grade of “C” or better on the previously completed course, and the course must have been offered on the same level (i.e., Bachelor, Master, and Doctorate) as the required S.A.V.E.D. GLOBAL course. S.A.V.E.D. Global I reserves the right to require any course regardless of a student’s previous courses.

Graduation Requirements:

Associate’s degree – requires the completion of 60 credit hours

Bachelor's Degree – requires the completion of 120 credit hours

Master's Degree – program-specific requirements

Doctorate Degree – program-specific requirements

Graduation Approval:

The Office of the Registrar must approve all candidates applying for graduation. Contact the Office of the Registrar to apply for graduation.

Transcripts:

The format of transcripts is as follows:

1. All courses taken at S.A.V.E.D. GLOBAL will be listed with the course number, course name, course grade, course hours, and quality points.
2. All transfer hours will be listed by total hours transferred into and accepted by S.A.V.E.D. GLOBAL. No course names, course numbers, or grades will appear for transfer hours.
3. All courses taken will be listed in order of completion, as appropriate.
4. Degree earned and date of program completion will appear on each transcript.
5. Honors earned, if any, will appear on the transcript.
6. No alterations will be made to transcript formats by S.A.V.E.D. GLOBAL. The format is fixed for all students.
7. No transcript will be issued until the student meets financial, administrative, and academic requirements.

All students requesting transcripts must submit a written request, including a handwritten signature. Requests must be received by traditional mail. Copy transcripts are \$6.00 for up to four pages and an additional \$1.00 per page.

BI 2105 Acts – 3 Credit Hours

This course provides an in-depth study of the Book of Acts, focusing on the birth and expansion of the early Church. Students will explore the work of the Holy Spirit, apostolic leadership, evangelism, and the development of the New Testament Church. Emphasis is placed on practical applications for modern-day ministry, including power, persecution, unity, and mission.

BI 1000 Bible Survey – 3 Credit Hours

This foundational course offers a comprehensive overview of the entire Bible, covering key themes, major events, and central figures from Genesis to Revelation. Students will gain a broad understanding of the structure, historical context, and message of Scripture, equipping them to see the Bible as one unified story of God's redemptive plan.

BI 2000 Biblical Study Resources – 3 Credit Hours

This course equips students with essential tools and methods for effective Bible study. Topics include how to use concordances, commentaries, Bible dictionaries, and digital resources, as well as principles of interpretation (hermeneutics). Students will develop skills to study Scripture accurately, responsibly, and with spiritual insight.

BI 2003 The Study of I & II Corinthians – 3 Credit Hours

This course examines Paul's letters to the Corinthian church, addressing issues such as church order, spiritual gifts, leadership, morality, and unity. Students will explore

the challenges faced by the early church and learn how Paul's teachings apply to contemporary ministry, character development, and church health.

BI 2004 General Epistles – 3 Credit Hours

This course provides a study of the General Epistles (Hebrews, James, I & II Peter, I, II & III John, and Jude). Emphasis is placed on themes such as faith, perseverance, holiness, false teachings, and spiritual maturity. Students will be challenged to apply these teachings to their personal walk and ministry practice.

Life Experience

All degrees at S.A.V.E.D. Global University Ministry offers earned degrees. This is achieved by mandatory coursework that must be completed. University transcripts do not always reflect real-life experience. S.A.V.E.D. Global University recognizes life experience that may have been gained through years of ministry-related work. Many people have served in ministry positions and gained knowledge and experience in their fields, but do not have any formal certificate, diploma, or degree. Credits of Life experience can give some of the recognition needed for this service in the work of the Lord.

The acceptance of life credits helps a potential student to accelerate their college learning experience and enables them to earn a fully accredited ministry-related degree. Applicants must have had more than five years in a recognized position in the ministry. No diplomas or degrees can be awarded based purely upon life experience. Life experience credit cannot be given for an entire degree but is limited to a specified number of credit hours. Life experience can include such things as: books authored, mission S.A.V.E.D. Global classes taught, outreach min S.A.V.E.D. Global events within a church, etc. Experience must be documented along with the years it occurred and submitted for evaluation.

Credit Transfers

S.A.V.E.D. Global University can transfer all credits from accredited institutions such as colleges, seminaries, Christian universities, etc. Courses transferred must be equivalent in content and requirements to courses in the S.A.V.E.D. Global University catalog.

The credits must be reported on an official transcript. No more than **15 credit hours** (including life experience credits) may be transferred.
